COMMUNITY MEMBERS TRAINED

97 per year on average

Over the past 10+ years CIER has facilitated training for community members on watershed management, traditional land use planning, community based monitoring, end-of-life vehicle decommissioning, waste management, and proposal writing etc.



COMMUNITY INVESTMENT

\$125,036 per year on average

We plan and implement our projects to ensure they provide the greatest possible value to our partner communities. This includes providing employment opportunities to community members, sourcing our equipment locally, and patronizing local businesses.



COMMUNITIES ENGAGED

112 per year on average

Our projects involve a variety of communities across Canada, some have had up to 60+ communities represented or involved.



YOUTH ENGAGED

256 on average per year

From 2006 to 2016, the number of First Nations, Métis and Inuit youth aged 15 to 34 increased by 39%, compared to just over 6% for their non-Indigenous youth. We plan to incorporate youth in to our projects whenever possible.
